Some twenty free workshops throughout the summer at the Jardins nourriciers de l'Avenue du Mont-Royal

June 24, 2022

L'Avenue du Mont-Royal is partnering with **Cultiver Montréal** to install nurturing gardens on Mount Royal Avenue, an 800-foot garden island with a variety of edible plant spaces, and to animate them throughout the summer by offering workshops for both novices and seasoned gardeners.

“The installations are already initiating a dialogue between the residents and merchants of the Plateau, as to the possibility of perpetuating nourishing spaces on Mount Royal Avenue,” says **Céline Duhamel**, general coordinator of Cultiver Montréal. About twenty producers and facilitators from the Montreal agricultural network have mobilized for this project.

At the **Jardins nourriciers**, located between Garnier and Fabre streets, some twenty free workshops will be given on Wednesdays and Saturdays from July 2 to September 3, 2022. The program includes a number of topics, from Agriculture 101 to Making Nature Art, Gardening with Urban Wildlife and Growing Mushrooms at Home.

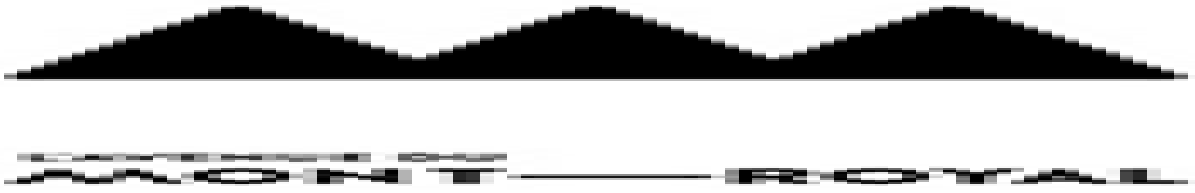

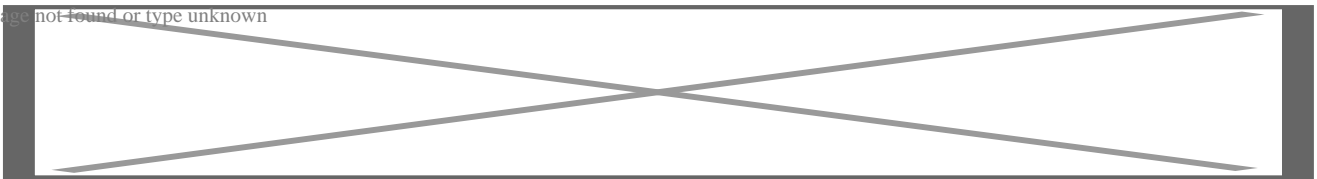
