The OCM welcomes 200 health care workers to the Maison symphonique

The **Orchestre classique de Montréal** (OCM) will conclude its 82nd season with a tribute to health care workers, conducted by Jacques Lacombe, on **Friday May 27, 2022** at 8 pm at the Maison symphonique. In this addition to the company's regular programming, several Canadian opera stars and the talented pianist **Jean-Philippe Sylvestre** will accompany the OCM in an all-Beethoven programme.

Thanks to the generous support of the evening's sponsor, **Medicom**, the OCM will invite 200 health care workers from the **Centre hospitalier de l'Université de Montréal** (CHUM) and the **Jewish General Hospital** (JGH) to the concert free of charge and will pay tribute to them.

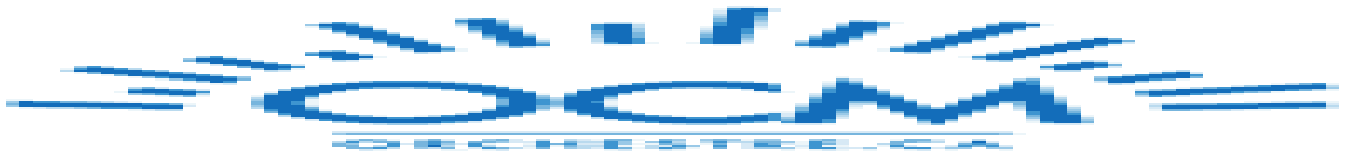
